# CHAPTER V CONCLUSION AND SUGGESTION

### 5.1 Conclusion

The researcher delivers the results of the data analysis in this chapter after evaluating the data in the preceding chapter. The purpose of this study is to examine the attitudes, polarities, and distributions that are most frequently observed in the children book "My Name is Stilton, Geronimo Stilton". Regarding the results, the analysis reveals that there were 43 statements in total about attitudes found in this study. Affect Negative (15 sentences), Affect Positive (10 sentences), Judgment Positive (10 phrases), and Judgement Negative (2 sentences) are the most prevalent appraisal attitudes and their polarities.

Affect negative distribution is the most prevalent one. Negative affect includes things like squeaking, muttering, crying, yelling, stammering, screaming, and shouting. Positive affective states include feeling grateful, crying, feeling whiskers, and being early. Perfect, great, good, attentive, get going, boss, you see boss, let me help you boss, great, and irritable are examples of judgment positives. Bad judgment: it wasn't necessary, and it wasn't to my liking. Positive reinforcement is generally calm, quiet, and typical; negative reinforcement is tugged, waved, mega cheese, nutrient-rich, and highly costly.

Because this children's book uses simple language and an easy-to-follow plot, the researcher's findings about its attitude are consistent with the expressions we frequently see in kids. Geronimo Stilton, the primary character, is the appraiser that the researchers find. This study still just looks at the first five chapters; possibly if the entire book is looked at, the findings will change. The nature and polarity of the attitudes in children's book "My Name is Stilton, Geronimo Stilton" are the main subjects of this study. It is still possible to look at other fascinating aspects of children's literature, including happy and angry depictions, or to utilize other theories to analyze the concepts presented in the children book.

### 5.2 Suggestion

Studying attitudes has advantages for people who are conducting research, instructing, learning, and beginning their education. Comparatively speaking to other studies on the subject of appraisal, this one has to be introduced to others. Additionally, future research can utilize this appraisal theory to translate books for children, teenagers, and other relevant audiences. As a result, the author first recommends that the following researchers study and investigate attitudes. Attitudes are present in many facets of life, not just children's literature.

The researcher, however, focuses solely on children's literature; in particular, she analyzes attitudes in the children book "My Name is Stilton, Geronimo Stilton". Finally, the author suggests that the next researcher use her findings as a reference to further their understanding.






