Translators must possess a deep understanding of both the source and target languages, as well as the cultural nuances associated with them.

translation studies that is a branch of translation studies developed in detail by (Toury, 1995) that involves the empirical and non-prescriptive analysis of source texts (ST) and target texts (TT) According to (Munday, 2001) descriptive translation studies is "a branch of pure research in Holmes's map of translation studies and has three possible foci: examination of the product, the function, and the process" with the aim of identifying the general characteristics and laws of translation. This definition emphasizes how crucial it is to communicate the context and the intended meaning in addition to the words. The need for professional translation services is increasing in today's worldwide society and spans a number of industries, including technology, business, law, and literature.

Translation shift based on (Catford, 1965) describes the modifications made when a text is translated from its original language to target language. Catford also makes a distinction between formal correspondence and textual equivalency. He identifies five types of translation shift: level shift, structure shift, class shift, unit shift, and intra-system shift. Level shift occurs when a source text item has a textual equivalent in the target language at a different level of language organization. For example, a verb in the source language may be translated as a noun in the target language. The other types of shift refer to changes in the structure, class, unit, or system of the text. Understanding translation shift is important for translators to ensure that the meaning and style of the original text are preserved in the translated text. "Translation is a change of form and this formal change takes place at different levels within a text" (Larson, (1984))

According to (Catford, 1965), introduced the concept of translation shifts in his work "A Linguistic Theory of Translation." Translation shifts refer to the changes or alterations that occur when translating a text from one language to another. Catford identified different

types of translation shifts, which help describe the linguistic and structural differences between the source language (SL) and the target language (TL). Types Translation shift basen on (Catford, 1965) have 4 Types such as ;

1. Structure Shift

Grammatical changes between the source and target languages are referred to as structure shifts . Sentence structure (S-V-O-Comp), phrase level (head-modifier), sentence type (active-passive), and other elements make up grammatical structure. the most prevalent type of shift is structure shift. Bellow is example of structure shift.

2. Class Shift

Class shifts happen when an SL item's translation counterpart belongs to a different class than the original item. These include transitions between different parts of speech. Part of speech is a linguistic category that includes nouns, verbs, adjectives, adverbs, pronouns, prepositions, conjunctions, and interjections. It is more specifically characterized by the syntactic or morphological behavior of the lexical item in question. The uses of the class shifts example below;

3. Unit Shift

Unit shifts diverge from formal correspondence, wherein a unit at one rank in the source language (SL) is

translated to a unit at a different rank in the target language (TL) . based on (Catford, 1965). *Rank* here refers to the hierarchical linguistics units of sentence, clause, group/phrase, word, and morpheme. The uses of the class shifts examples below;

4. Unit Intra Shift

When SL and TL have systems that roughly correspond to one another in terms of their structure, yet translation requires choosing a word that is non-corresponding in the TL system, this is known as an intra-system shift (Catford in Munday, 2001: 61). The uses of the intra-system shifts examples below;

The houses in tangerang was broken (SL)

Plural

Rumah di tangerang sudah rusak (TT)

Singular

Understanding these types of translation shifts based on Catford's framework provides translators and researchers with a comprehensive tool for analyzing the intricacies of the translation process and making informed decisions to maintain fidelity to the source text while adapting to the target language and culture.

In general of global communication, translation serves as a vital conduit for transmitting religious and spiritual knowledge across linguistic and cultural frontiers. This journal embarks on an exploration of the intricate translation shifts encountered in the

rendering of Mahfudzot lessons from Arabic to Indonesian. Rooted in Islamic teachings, Mahfudzot summarizes a multitude of moral and ethical precepts drawn from sacred writings, most notably the Quran.

The framework of translation shifts proposed by (Catford, 1965) taxonomy provides a systematic approach to understanding the nuanced transformations that occur during the translation process. Applying this framework to Mahfudzot lessons facilitates a comprehensive analysis of the lexical, grammatical, and cultural adjustments made as these sacred teachings transition from the Arabic source to the Indonesian target language. cross-cultural communication and the art of translation. Additionally, the works of linguistic scholars who have delved into the challenges of translating religious texts, such as Abdullah and Ismail's exploration of translating the Quran or works (Catford, 1965) "A Linguistic Theory of Translation" and Bassnett's "Translation Studies"

Research on translation shift has been found, one of which is "shift Translation shift in English into Indonesian subtitle of Guzaarish movie" by (Fitria , 2020) which focuses on translation shifts found in the English to Indonesian subtitle of Guzaarish movie. or research "An analysis of english-Indonesia translation shift in the Hannah Banana Short Story by" (Muhtalifah, 2012) The main objective of this analysis is to know translation shift of Hannah Banana from English. But in this study the researcher wrestled on translation shifting in mahfudzot lesson, which focused on translation between Arabic to

Indonesian. This is one of the interesting rights in this study.

The object of this research journal is a mahfudzot lesson which famous leason in islamic boarding school. A research method is a tool, procedure, and technique chosen during research to collecting data. This research uses a qualitative descriptive method. In the descriptive method, collecting data in mahfudzot lesson. This is due to the use of qualitative methods. Qualitative research prioritizes the quality, quality or content of material weight and research evidence, which is to report the results of translation from Arabic into Indonesia

from Islamic Boarding School According (Abdullah, T.A., & Ismail, A., 2013) In the islamic boarding school tradition, students are required to memorize the words - Arabic aphorisms often known as mahfudzot as media to raise the enthusiasm of the students. The aphorisms were made up tiered according to the needs of Islamic Boarding School.

The phase changes position to "akal yang sempurna" (Head-modifier). The "akal seseorang" in the phrase is the head and "telah sempurna" is the modifier in the phrase
